**A. Call to Order**

Chairman Coker called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

**B. Introductions, Presentations and Announcements**

Executive Director Mann presented Compliance Specialist Steve Jacobs with his 20-year service ring. He also thanked Compliance Specialist Mike Rosenberger for his service; this is Mike's last meeting, he is leaving to pursue other career choices. He then thanked Jim DeLung for his 11 years of service at AZ POST. Jim is a sergeant with the Phoenix Police Department and has been on contract to AZ POST for the past 11 years; he is retiring effective today. He also informed the Board that IADLEST is applying for a federal grant to conduct human trafficking training. AZ POST is looking at becoming one of the national trainers in human trafficking. He stated to the Board that the RF designation for charging cases has been renamed to signify *Resolve in Future* rather than *Research Further*. This will clarify that the case although closed will be resolved when and if further information is available. He reminded everyone that the Special Olympics Barbecue will be held at DPS on April 17.

**C. Legislative Update**

Executive Director Mann stated HB2564, which changes the population numbers for the chiefs of police representatives on the Board, was amended at the last minute. It raised the population number for big cities to 400,000 or more. This will cut out cities with populations of 200,000-400,000. He has asked that this bill be sent to a conference committee in order to change it back to the original request. He also discussed HB 2517 dealing with firearms regulated by the state and other bills of interest to AZ POST.

**D. Budget Update and Discussion**

Executive Director Mann presented the budget as it relates to revenue decline and future basic training expenditures. He discussed the academy expenditures and asked for the Board's input on how to proceed in the future. After a lengthy discussion, it was determined that a subcommittee would be created to review this matter further, come up with some solutions and then bring this matter back to the full Board at a future date.

Chief Campbell made a motion to create a subcommittee to review budget options and models and in conjunction with staff bring this back to the Board, seconded by Sheriff Mascher, motion carried unanimously.

**E. Final Action Cases:**
