A. Call to Order

Chairman Coker called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m.

B. Introductions, Presentations and Announcements

Executive Director Mann introduced Sergeant Timothy Williams of the Cochise County Sheriff's Office. Sergeant Williams is a new Board member; he replaces Sergeant Anthony Nelson. He welcomed members of the Indonesian National Police and Ministry of Forestry who are back once again to research peace officer standards and training in Arizona. He informed the Board that there will be quite a few cases on the November agenda; he will also be discussing with the Board new rule changes concerning drug standards. He explained to the Board that today's meeting is being videotaped for training purposes. He also informed the Board that he recently made a presentation on Human Trafficking to the Governor's Council.

Chief Campbell made a motion to **Initiate Proceedings**, and amended the motion to include rule violations of R13-4-109(A)(7, 8 and 9), seconded by Sheriff Mascher, motion carried with one nay vote.

Detention Director Olson recused himself from this case. The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Mike Deltenre. Professor Stemley made a motion to **Resolve in Future**, seconded by Sheriff Masher, motion fails. Sheriff Mascher made a motion to close this case with **No Action**, seconded by Mr. Pacheco, motion carried unanimously.

Case #4 – Brandon A. Foy – Bullhead City Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Steve Jacobs. Mr. Brown made a motion to close this case with **No Action**, seconded by Chief Rodbell, motion carried unanimously.

Case #5 – John P. Geroulis – Phoenix Police Department
