**A. Call to Order**

Chairman Coker called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

**B. Introductions, Presentations and Announcements**

Compliance Manager Jack Lane informed the Board that Executive Director Lyle Mann was at the legislature and would not be in attendance at today's meeting. He then welcomed new staff member Don Yennie. Don is the new Training Manager and is back at AZ POST as a full-time employee instead of as a contract employee.

**C. Legislative Update**

Compliance Manager Jack Lane stated HB2564 is being heard today and Executive Director Mann will be testifying at this hearing. Chief Campbell requested that staff keep Board members advised if any legislation that might impact AZ POST is being considered. Chairman Coker stated he felt it would be good for the Board to receive regular updates on exactly what Executive Director Mann is doing in his legislative duties and asked that this be considered.

**D. Training Audit Deficiencies – St. Johns Police Department**

This matter has been resolved and will not be addressed on today's agenda.

**E. Litigation Report. *Enkhaus v. Arizona Peace Officer Standards and Training Board et al***

Assistant Attorney General Nancy Beck stated that the appeal filed by former police officer Christopher Enkhaus was denied by the Superior Court of Maricopa County. The Court concluded that the evidence supported the decision of the Board. Chairman Coker thanked Assistant A.G. Beck for her hard work and stated the Board's appreciation.

**F. Doctorial Findings Presented by Dr. Laura A. Molinaro**

Dr. Molinaro presented her dissertation on *Examination of Contributory Factors to the Low Representation of Women in Law Enforcement*. She discussed the study conducted by focus groups that examined the low percentage of women in sworn law enforcement ranks serving in Arizona.
